IGP Institute and department give away 15,000 pounds of flour

The strong partnership between the IGP Institute and the Kansas Wheat Commission led to 20,000 pounds of wheat being donated to the Hal Ross Flour Mill by Kansas farmers in the spring of 2020.

The decision was made to mill the wheat into flour and donate the flour to the local community to help offset shortages at supermarkets resulting from increased demand and disruptions in the supply chain due to the pandemic.

With support from university administration, IGP Institute instructors and department faculty and staff reopened the Hal Ross Flour Mill in early June and milled the donated wheat, resulting in 15,000 pounds of flour. Flour packaging and labels were donated and the distribution date for the 1,500 10 pound bags was set.

On June 18, volunteers from the department, the university, and partner organizations handed out flour at the drive-through event in front of the Hal Ross Flour Mill. Multiple media outlets covered the four-hour distribution to a steady line of vehicles flowing past the mill.

The event was a great success. All 1,500 bags were handed out in just under four hours, averaging nearly six cars per minute.

"This was an opportunity to take our expertise and give back to the local community at a time where it seemed appropriate," said Gordon Smith, Department Head and IGP Institute Director.
