State Wheat Leaders Explore Flour Milling at IGP

IGP hosted the annual Flour Milling for State Wheat Leaders and Staff, December 8–10. Participants from six states traveled to IGP to expand their knowledge of flour milling and wheat quality.

This course was designed to provide wheat growers and industry personnel with training on the basic principles of flour milling, while strengthening their understanding of the relationship between wheat quality and flour performance.

Participants took part in a series of lectures and hands-on training in the K-State milling facilities, including the Hal Ross Flour Mill, the table-top milling lab, and the baking lab in Shellenberger Hall. Outside of the classroom, participants also toured the Kansas Wheat Innovation Center.

Course topics explored how milling systems work together, from wheat cleaning and conditioning through extraction and blending, while giving participants hands-on experience with flowsheets and milling calculations. The course also highlighted the impact of wheat quality on extraction rates, along with practical approaches to flour and dough testing and understanding flour functionality.
